

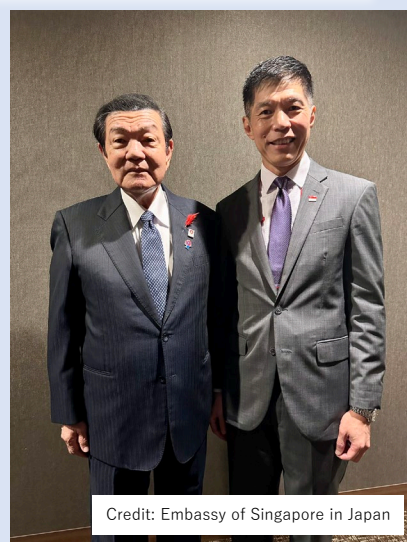

- October 23: Osaka Healthcare Pavilion ceremony, preview, and lighting ceremony held in Yumeshima

- October 25: Eight new projects chosen for the Cabinet Secretariat's Expo International Exchange Program
- November 1: Hieizan Railway begins operation of cable cars with Expo design headmarks (November 1–October 2025)
- November 1: West Japan Railway Company wraps cars in the Okayama area with Expo designs (until the end of the Expo)
- November 3: Expo Classroom in Waseda University: Science and Engineering Exhibition
- November 5: Expo Classroom in Aoyama Gakuin University

1. Official Participants

- October 22; Designs of contents of four African countries (Algeria, Angola, Gabon, and Tunisia) were disclosed on the BIE website.
 - **Algeria:** Initiatives related to the SDGs under the Expo subtheme "saving lives."
 - **Angola:** Improvement of educational standards to enhancement the quality of life".
 - **Gabon:** Experiences related to climate change, biodiversity and effective use of natural resources.
 - **Tunisia:** History of the nation starting from Carthage; scientists and medical professionals who have engaged in international cooperation.

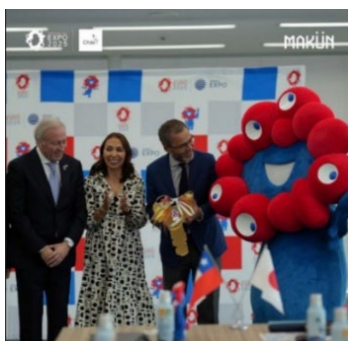


Tunisia Pavilion

- October 28; Hungary announced details of its pavilion. The first floor will be the exhibition area, the second floor will house a restaurant and a wine bar and the third floor will be a business area to promote opportunities for Hungarian companies. Live performances of traditional music will be offered in a large dome designed to resemble a haystack.

2. Reports from the past week and plans for the upcoming week

- October 22 to 25; BIE Secretary General Dimitri Kerkentzes visited Japan. After inspecting the Expo site on October 24, he met with Governor Hirofumi Yoshimura of Osaka Prefecture and Mayor Hideyuki Yokoyama of the City of Osaka. On October 25, Mr Kerkentzes took part in the Steering Committee alongside representatives from official participants. In the press conference, he expressed his confidence that “a beautiful venue will open on April 13” and added that companies from around the world will come to Osaka during the world.



- October 23; The Osaka Healthcare Pavilion held a preview ceremony for stakeholders and the media at Yumeshima. Government officials, the Association, Myaku-Myaku and Osaka media personalities took part in the event.

- October 25 to November 15; Mitsubishi UFJ Financial Group is holding a promotional event titled MUFG's Find Your Favorite Pavilion on the ground floor of its headquarters in Osaka. - October 25; The Cabinet Secretariat's Expo Promotion Headquarters added eight new certifications to the Expo International Exchange Program, which promotes exchanges between local governments in Japan and official participants. 4. O&As

Pre-visits for educational trips

Will the Association allow teachers and school officials to conduct pre-visits of the Expo for them to better plan the educational trips for the students? Also in case the school decides not to proceed with the trip, will they be charged for the pre-visits?

- i. Given the large interest pre-visits for educational trips, it is difficult to meet all such requests, but the Association plans to accommodate pre-visits during the Test Run, which is planned around a week before the opening.
- ii. Admission tickets will not be charged for pre-visits even in cases where the school decides not to follow through with the educational trip.
