





2. <u>Reports from the past week and plans for the upcoming week</u>

- November 19; Yasuhiro Tsuyuki, the <u>Chief of the National Police Agency</u>, inspected the Expo site. The following day, he visited the Osaka Prefectural Police and instructed them to take thorough measures to ensure safety and security.



- November 27; The Cabinet Secretariat held a <u>symposium on Expo 2025 in the City of Gifu</u> in central Japan. Expo Minister Yoshihiko Ito and Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Yoji Muto contributed video messages, while Governor Hajime Furuta of Gifu Prefecture and the head of the local business federation delivered greetings as guests. A talk session featuring Expo special supporter Ai Haruna and an introduction to initiatives by Gifu Prefecture related to the Expo were also featured.



November 22; Expo Minister Yoshihiko Ito participated in the <u>Power of Sports and Culture</u> session at the general meeting of the <u>Club Franco-Japonaise</u> held in Tokyo. He expressed his desire to deepen international exchanges through the Expo including with France. Signature Pavilion producer and film director Naomi Kawase also took the stage to introduce her pavilion.







- November 27; A delegation from the <u>Kansai business community held a promotional event</u> <u>for the Expo in Beijing</u>. After greetings from Vice Chairman Mototsugu Sato of the Kansai Economic Federation and Vice Chairman Li Qingshuang of the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade, representatives from the Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO) and the Association took the stage to outline the highlights of the Expo. There were also opportunities for commemorative photos with Myaku-Myaku and a lottery for Expo-related goods.



- November 29; The Association made public its Medical Emergency Response Implementation Plan. This plan builds upon the eponymous Basic Plan released in August 2023 and includes further details on medical facilities and response measures to injury and illness of visitors and staffs.

- November 28; As part of the Cabinet Secretariat's <u>Expo School Caravan</u> project, Signature Pavilion producer Professor Shinichi Fukuoka held a lecture at the Ebara Fifth Junior High School in Shinagawa Ward, Tokyo.. The class provided materials that encouraged students to reconsider the meaning of life from the perspective of insects, using cockroaches and mosquitoes as subjects.





- November 13; Osaka Prefecture established an <u>ordinance to regulate the use of drones and</u> <u>other devices</u> in certain periods and areas deemed necessary for security to ensure the smooth preparation and operation of the Expo. The specific target area, shown below, was announced on November 28. The regulations are scheduled to take effect on January 19, 2025.

5. <u>Q & As</u>

- 1) In response to the methane gas explosion accident, the Association is in the process of adjusting a plan to allocate 6.2 billion yen from the contingency fund for safety measures and costs associated with changes in the types of overseas pavilions.
 - i. The utilisation of the contingency fund for site construction in response to unforeseen events including methane gas safety measures and changes in security measures was approved by the Board of Directors of the Association. This has also been discussed in the government's Expo 2025 Budget Execution Monitoring Committee. The latest estimates indicate that the costs associated with these measures are expected to be approximately 8.7 billion yen.
 - ii. Due to the recent stabilisation of price increases of construction materials as well as efforts by the Association on efficient cost management, approximately 2.5 billion yen in costs have been reduced. As a result, the current estimate for the execution of the contingency fund is about 6.2 billion yen.
 - iii. Furthermore, there is no change in the total venue construction cost of 235 billion yen, and the response will be managed within the scope of the 13 billion yen contingency fund.

- 2) Is there any increase in the Expo-related items in the supplementary govenment budget?
 - i. The costs for venue construction, the construction of the Japan Pavilion and support for the participation of developing countries have not changed from the total estimated national costs related to the Expo presented in February of this year.
 - ii. On the other hand, costs for nationwide momentum-building activities and ensuring thorough safety within the venue have been calculated and included as necessary items.
 - iii. Regarding the costs for nationwide momentum-building activities, it was stated in the February announcement that it would be approximately 4 billion yen plus future costs. As part of these future costs, approximately 2.9 billion yen has been included in this supplementary budget.

iv. For the costs to ensure thorough safety within the venue, given the continued high demand for safety measures, approximately 24.9 billion yen has been allocated to ensure comprehensive safety measures.
