1. Official Participants

- December 26; Building work for the <u>Philippines</u> Pavilion has been completed. The exterior is to be decorated with textiles by over 200 artisans from 18 regions of the Philippines. The pavilion will express the Philippines' rich traditions, diverse nature and creativity.

- <u>The United States</u> officially launched its pavilion's website. The site provides an overview of the pavilion and the official character Spark, as well as details on participating in its programmes, meeting space reservations and job information.

2. <u>Reports from the past week and plans for the upcoming week</u>

- January 3; The Association released the <u>Myaku-Myaku Statement</u> to mark 100 days before the opening of the Expo. The statement was released in response to the question of why an Expo should be held in an era when people can connect online, conveying the significance of chance encounters.

- December 24; <u>The Association, with support from Sekisui Chemical</u>, released to the press perovskite solar cells to be installed at the bus terminal at the Expo site. The 257 film-shaped solar cells, which cover a rounded roof for a distance of about 250 metres, will provide power source for night-time lighting. This is the first time in Japan that such a large number of solar cells have been installed in a public facility.



- December 24; The Association has announced details of the <u>Ao and the Night Rainbow</u> <u>Parade</u>, to be held every day during the Expo. The details include the character design, voice actors and theme song. The event, which will be held by the Water Plaza, will include a water show linked to the parade and content making use of augmented reality (AR) technology.



There are countries that have announced that they will not be participating, but what is the actual situation regarding the number of countries that have announced their participation in the current Expo?

i. As of 6 January, 167 official participants (158 countries and 9 international organisations) have announced their participation in the Expo. On December 27, the list of participating countries on the Ministry of Foreign Affairs website was updated to reflect Cape Verde's participation announcement and withdrawals by Botswana, El Salvador, Iran and South Africa.
