1. Special Feature: Highlights of the Expo: <u>Improvements to the method of purchasing admission tickets</u>

On February 25, Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba and Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Yoji Muto announced changes to make it easier to buy tickets. The measures were announced at a meeting with the Expo Committee of the National Governors' Association.

- Easy Reservation Tickets will be introduced. These online tickets can be purchased without registering Expo IDs; visitors will not be able to make advance reservations of pavilions and events but can book them once inside.
- On-site tickets will also be made available. Visitors will be able to buy tickets for that day in front of the entrance gate.
- Discounts for the Season Pass will be on offer, at 24,000 yen instead of 30,000 yen, to those who have made one-day visits in April and May and feel that they want to come back for more.
- Season Pass holders will be able to enter the Expo from 9am throughout the event; they will no longer have to wait until 11am..
- An 'Easy Guide to Enjoying the Expo' (title to be confirmed) will be published. The guide will target visitors who plan to visit the Expo without advance pavilion reservations.

2.Introduction of pavilion exhibits

An introduction of official pavilions selected by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry at its own discretion.

1) Ireland





- The pavilion design will be based on the <u>triskelion</u>, an ancient Celtic motif. The three spirals represent Ireland, Japan and the spirit of creative collaboration.
- On June 14, the National Day, musicians, dancers and performers will wear emerald green, Ireland's symbolic colour, to celebrate <u>St Patrick's Day</u>.

2) Monaco



- The pavilion is inspired by Japanese and Mediterranean gardens. <u>Fine wines and cognacs brought in from the renowned Hôtel de Paris Monte Carlo</u> in Monaco can be tasted in the wine cellar-style lounge and on the terrace decorated with rose petals loved by the House of Grimaldi.
- The National Day on June 28 will feature orchestra performance by the Grand Duke Gun Cavalry Company as well as ballet and dance by the Royal Grace Ballet School of Monaco.

3)Australia



- The pavilion reuses materials from previous major international events. The exterior is inspired by <u>Australia's iconic eucalyptus flower</u>, symbolising the country's <u>vibrancy and diversity</u>.
- The pavilion will host a range of cultural events and business programs that will allow visitors to experience Australia's latest technology, rich culture and dynamic society.
- The National Day is September 3.

4) Malaysia



- The pavilion is built from environmentally friendly materials such as bamboo and oil palm trunks. It will be lit up at night, giving it a fantastic appearance different from daytime.
- The exhibit will showcase Malaysia's <u>diverse culture and vibrant economy</u> through traditional food, dance, crafts and play, as well as immersive exhibits using cutting-edge technology.
- The National Day is September 8.

- ➢ Date: May 18
- Venue: EXPO Arena Matsuri
- Appearing on Fuji TV's noon live variety show "Poka Poka"! A special performance by SHOW-WA and MATSURI group of performers, produced by Yasushi Akimoto, born with the concept of popular songs from Showa era in the modern age.



EXPO 2025 Japan Bonsai & Suiseki (small naturally occurring stones) Exhibition

- ➢ Date: May 19-22
- Venue: EXPO Messe WASSE
- A wide range of *bonsai*, or diminutive trees in containers tendered over the years to make it appear like miniature versions of fully-grown trees, will be on display. In addition, lectures and demonstrations by *bonsai* professionals will also take place.

Digital Twin Perspectives – Real and virtual urban futures - *

- ➢ Date: May 20-24
- Venue: Gallery WEST
- A Digital Twin technology will be presented by integrating a 3D city model (PLATEAU) and a 3D model of the Expo site, to be experienced through vision and vibration on a virtual-reality chair.



Niihama Taiko Festival *

- > Date: May 21
- Venue: EXPO Arena Matsuri
- A sumptuous drum performance on used at the Niihama Taiko Festival will be on offer. Visitors will also get to take turns being the load bearer, or *kakifu*, of the stands.

- Inspired by the world of the classic Kabuki play "Yoshitsune Senbonzakura" and virtual idol Hatsune Miku's trademark song "Senbonzakura", this one-of-a-kind entertainment combines the stylistic beauty of kabuki with NTT's technology to provide the most modern take on the logstanding art of *kabuki* theater.



Cosaka Week -Spring-] Kansai Medical University's medical care for the near <u>future</u>

- > Date: May 18
- Venue: Gallery WEST
- The event will introduces unique initiatives such as photoimmunotherapy and new drug development in the field of cancer, practical application of sensory drug discovery technology that activates immune functions through smell, personalised medicine based on genome information and latest medicine using iPS cells. There will also be a hands-on exhibition on medical technology for future doctors.

- The Reconstruction Agency and the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry will exhibit at the Community and Mobility Week of the Future, focusing on reconstruction of the disaster-affected areas under the themes 'Earthquake Legacy and Disaster Response', 'Food and Fisheries', 'Latest Technology' and 'Fukushima International Research and Education



Institution (F-REI)'. METI will exhibit the trajectory of the redevelopment of the coastal Fukushima region as a testing ground for solving social issues.

4. Promotion Activities

- February 22; Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Yoji Muto visited the Expo site. Riding the Osaka Metro as visitors would from April 13, Minister Muto took turns viewing the Signature Pavilions, the State Guest House and the Japan Pavilion. Upon conclusion of the visit, he reiterated his commitment to promote the event to the public within Japan and around the world.



- February 21; The Cabinet Secretariat announced the 12th and final registration the exchange plans between official participants and local governments. A total of 154 exchange plans have been registered by 95 local authorities, consisting of 19 prefectures and 76 municipalities.
