1. Special Feature: Highlights of the Expo:

The Grand Ring was completed!!



On February 28, the Grand Ring, the symbol of the Expo site and the <u>world's largest wooden</u> <u>building</u>, was completed and handed it over to the Association.

- The Grand Ring combines modern construction methods with non-nail *nuki* joints that have traditionally been used for shrines and temples in Japan.
- It will provide the main flow of pedestrian traffic in the venue while shielding visitors from rain, wind and sunlight.
- The rooftop will be a place for visitors to take in the view of the entire Expo venue, surrounded by the sea and sky, as well as cityscape of Osaka and the Seto Inland Sea bathed in the setting sun.
- On Tuesday, March 4, the Guinness World Records recognised the Grand Ring as the world's largest wooden building. A plaque commemorating the record will be installed at the venue.
 - < Overview of the Grand Ring >
 - Building area (horizontal projection area):
 61,035.55 square metres
 - Inner diameter: 615m
 - Outer diameter: 675m
 - Total circumference: Approximately 2km, Width: 30m, Height: 12m to 20m



• Approximately 70% domestic wood (cedar, cypress), 30% imported wood (red pine)

2.Introduction of pavilion exhibits

An introduction of official pavilions selected by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry at its own discretion.

1) EU



- The design of the pavilion is inspired by the three concepts of the <u>New European</u> <u>Bauhaus</u>: sustainability, beauty and inclusion. The interior will feature immersive installations and activities including sessions by prominent speakers. Visitors will be able to learn about the EU and Japan's progress towards the common goal of nurturing the future.
- The National Day is May 9.

2) Chile



- In the centre of the pavilion will be an installation of <u>CLT construction</u>, a material made of wood planks stacked vertically and glued together under high pressure, and a large <u>Makün tapestry woven by 200 artisans from the La Araucanía region</u>. In addition to Chilean food, visitors can taste Chilean wine and pisco in the pavilion.
- On National Day, May 12, music and dance will be performed in the EXPO National Day Hall Rey Garden.

3) Belgium



- The pavilion embodies the <u>three states of water: solid, gaseous and liquid</u>. There will be a stage in front of the pavilion where performances take place. The museum will offer a tour of several exhibition rooms, a translucent façade and a spiral walkway leading up to the roof, where a bar and restaurant overlooking the Forest of Tranquillity can be reached.
- The National Day is September 14 and will feature concerts, shows and performances on several pop-up stages.

4) Bahrain



- The pavilion is inspired by traditional Bahraini vessels. Embodies the country's maritime traditions that have served as a gateway to the Gulf region. The pavilion, constricted with recycled materials and Japanese wood processing, will showcase the maritime heritage that has shaped Bahrain's identity through the ages.
- The National Day is 18 September. Live music will be held at the EXPO National Day Hall Rey Garden.

■ Sosei Kagura Stage "THE SAIVIOUR-The Age of Total Savior-"

- Date: May 26
- Venue: EXPO Hall Shine Hat
- The stage is based on a mythical story of the creation of the universe, with the theme of the bond of life, survival of the earth and the future of humanity. Graphics, animation and stage sets will be used for the direction of a *sosei kagura*, the modern, creative iteration of the ancient *kagura* stage.

Beyond 5G ready Showcase

- Date: May 26 June 3
- Venue: EXPO Messe WASSE
- A large-scale exhibition will be held where visitors can experience the cities and lifestyles of the future realised by Beyond 5G (6G), the next generation of wireless communication technology after 5G, using the latest technology.

- Date: May 27 June1
- Venue: Gallery EAST, Pop-up Stage South
- Young artisans, craftsmen, and creators who have inherited traditional crafts from all over Japan will gather to exhibit and market works of craftsmanships.

■ Metaverse (XR)/AI Awards

- Date: May 28
- Venue: EXPO Hall Shine Hat
- Commendation for initiatives such as metaverse, AI, and XR that solve social issues.

- > Date: May 25

- The island of Awaji, to the west of the Expo venue in the Seto Inland Sea, is known as the first island amongst the Japanese archipelago to be created by the deities.
- Ningyo Joruri, a doll opera, Awaji Kokusai Sousei Kagura, a creative dance performed by children, Danjiri

Uta by Goshikinohime, a festive song, and Takataya Taiko, a drum performance, will together narrate the story of Awaji Island.

Exhibitions and hands-on booths are set up to enable visitors to experience the attractions of Nara's food, culture and industry through all five senses.

7. <u>Q&A's</u>

1) Timber used in the Grand Ring

Unreliable sources in non-traditional media have reported that "most of the timber in the Grand Ring comes from Finland". The facts are entirely wrong.

- i. The total volume of timber used in the Grand Ring is approximately 27,000 cubic metres, of which m3, of which domestic timber (cedar and cypress) accounts for approximately 70% and imported timber (red pine) for approximately 30%.
- ii. The imported timber is used for some of the pillars of the Grand Ring.
