Kuwait is poised to make a significant impression at Expo 2025 with its pavilion, "The Visionary Lighthouse," embodying the nation's bold vision for New Kuwait 2035 — a future rooted in tradition yet propelled by innovation.

H.E. Mr. Abdul Rahman Baddah Al-Mutairi, Minister of Information and Culture and Minister of State for Youth Affairs of the State of Kuwait, recently met with H.E. Mr. ITO Yoshitaka, Minister for the World Expo 2025, to reaffirm Kuwait's commitment to supporting the success of EXPO 2025 OSAKA, KANSAI. H.E. March 5; the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) announced that Norika Fujiwara had been appointed as the Honourary Director of the Japan Pavilion by Minister Yoji Muto. The Honourary Director will be in charge of accosting domestic an international guests as well as promoting the Japan Pavilion to a wide audience.

The Japan Pavilion will aim to foster new understandings on the realisation of a recycling-oriented society, under the theme of Between Life and Life. 2. Introduction of pavilion exhibits

An introduction of official pavilions selected by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry at its own discretion.

1) Azerbaijan



- The pavilion is characterised by <u>seven large arches</u>. A statue of the Seven Beauties under the arches will welcome visitors. The pavilion includes an omni-directional projection video show, exhibitions on Azerbaijani culture, art and nature, and a restaurant combining Japanese and Azerbaijani gardens.
- The National Day will be on June 5.

2) Kuwait



- The architecture will represent a widely spread wing. Consisting of a gallery, garden, courtyard and five themed interactive rooms, the pavilion will presens <u>Kuwait's past</u>, <u>present and future as seen through its history and personal stories</u> in an immersive exhibition. Visitors can also sample traditional Kuwaiti cuisine in the pavilion's restaurant.
- The National Day will be on June 19.

3) Germany



- Consisting of circular-shaped wooden pavilion made of <u>reusable building materials</u>, the pavilion itself will be an exhibition of sustainable architecture. Inside, visitors can experience the <u>living in a recycling-oriented society</u> through an immersive exhibition that stimulates the five senses. The pavilion will also feature a restaurant 'Oishii! Germany' with German and Japanese specialties and a shop 'Omiyage! Germany' with a wide range of German souvenirs.
- The National Day will be on June 20.

4) United Nations



- 35 UN agencies will participate together in an exhibit including the <u>80-year history of</u> <u>the UN and its efforts to address global challenges and humanitarian crises</u>. UN officials, experts, celebrities, supporters and other guests will be welcomed to share their knowledge and experiences on global challenges and solutions.
- The Special Day, the equivalent of the National Day for international organisations, will be on August 22.

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4. <u>Promotion Activities</u>

March 10; JETRO Chairman Norihiko Ishiguro announced JETRO's efforts to promote overseas business in connection with the Expo. Business seminars are scheduled to be held during the Expo to coincide with the arrival of foreign dignitaries and business delegations. At present, 61 requests for cooperation have been received from 43 countries and regions. Mr Ishuguro also briefed the media on the new portal site for Expo-related business, which was launched on March 13.



- March 3; The National Mint held a ceremony at the Osaka Mint building to mark the launch of the <u>third issue of the Expo coins</u>. In attendance were Masayoshi Matsumoto, Chairman of the Kansai Economic Federation, Senko Ikenobo, incoming headmaster of the Ikenobo flower arrangement school, and Expo Producer and architect Sousuke Fujimoto, who spoke about his thoughts on the Expo and the highlights of the event.

7. <u>Q&A's</u>

1) Erosion of embankment at the Water Plaza

- i. A part of the earthen embankment at the at the seawall of the Water Plaza, located in the southeast of the Expo site, has been eroded by waves.
- ii. The Association reports that the cause of the erosion was due to higher-than-expected waves which caused a water flow between the Water Plaza and the Sea of Connections due to the difference in heights between the two bodies of water.
- iii. The Grand Ring, which lies on top of the embarkment, is supported by a support layer approximately 60 meters underground, and there is no safety hazard regarding it – the issue is purely aesthetical. The Association is examining practical measures while ensuring that the opening of the exhibition will not be affected.
