By the end of June, we are planning to organize sister city exchange programmes for participants in the "International Conference of Rotary Club" held in Lisbon. Then in the beginning of July, we will hold together with the "Portugal-Japan Friendship Parliamentary Group", a "Sake Tasting Fair" at the Assembly of the Republic, to name a few.

I am glad that following cities are making exchange activities with Japanese cities individually: Porto, Aveiro, Leiria, Abrantes, Sintra, Cascais, Vila do Bispo, and Evora.

Though the season of sakura flowers is over, I hope that sakura and the "Festa do Japão" shall bloom every year in this "Garden of Japan", in order to maintain and strengthen our existing friendship between Japan and Portugal.
