Speech by H.E. Mr. Nobutaka Shinomiya, Ambassador of Japan to Portugal, On the occasion of Reporting Session of Basic Research on Lisbon Smart City Project September 18th, 2013, Lisbon

In the following session, NEDO will present plan of possible next steps and what it takes to realize it. I believe that strong commitment by the responsible authorities and participants on both sides will determine the project's success. I hope this will lay down a solid foundation for building a more active business relationship between our two nations and take it to the next level.

I am also proud to say that such a kind of project involving the most advanced technology in the world is led by Japan and Portugal together. I am sure that this project will contribute to the development of the two countries and present a model for other societies.

Once again, let me express my sincere gratitude to all of you who took part in this project. Lastly, allow me to make a personal announcement. My tenure as ambassador here will end shortly. I will be leaving Portugal early next month. I sincerely thank you for your kind support and cooperation during my three years here, and I truly hope that you will be as kind to my successor as you were to me. I wish your continued happiness and success in the future.
